<u>ŠRI YANTRA</u>

In the Vedic rituals, Yantra, Mandala and Tantra has a range of meaning. Yantra & Mandala involves objects with geometric patterns, diagram, design and art. Tantra involves complex rituals and special techniques to attain the religious goals viz. healing, mediums, prognosticators, meditations, spiritual bliss.





Šākta or Šri Vidyā tradition reveals various forms of Goddesses, the manifestations and emergence of divine consciousness power through mandala and yantra system, simply referred as Šri Yantra, Šri Chakra Yantra, Mahāmeru Yantra, Devi Yantra. It is indeed the representation of all that exists in the universe at macrocosmic level as well as microcosmic level.

Yantra based worship system is elaborately described in the Šãkta Tantra (a text on powerful doctrine of rituals and ceremonies). In our temple, we adapt such text namely *Devi Mahātmiyam* from *Mārkandeya Purana* and chapter 38 & 39 of *suksmāgama* (7th of 28 Moola-Ãgamas). The rituals are popularly referred as *Navāvarana Pooja* or Šakti Peetārchana that are performed every full-moon day and during the *Devi Navarātri* festivals (nine-day event). It is said that performance of this *pooja* will result in long life, good health, wealth, knowledge & wisdom, success in all endeavor, fulfillment of all needs, destruction of all negativities, paramount power.

The number nine and its multiple numbers are said to be the form and also the *mantra* (*navākshari*) of *Devi*. Festival for *Devi* is always observed for nine days (*Navarātri*). The true or essential nature of *Devi* is narrated in 36 *tatvās* (principal elements). Hence, the name of *pooja* performed to *Devi* is referred as *Navāvarana Pooja* as She is seated in the throne, with nine enclosures, shielded by the guardian deities. The abode is referred as *Šripuram*. Hence, her seat is specifically called as *Šri Yantra* or *Šri Chakra Yantra* or *Mahã Meru Peetam*. The personification of *Devi* is said to be of combined forces of the Goddesses *Durga*, *Lakshmi & Saraswati*. The literary meaning of *Šri Yantra* is an instrument of power and wealth.


The structure of *Šri Yantra* is described as a geometric embodiment of the Goddess unfolding from bindu (central point), at the heart of the inner *trikona* (triangles), and expands outward in a series of interlocking triangles and encompassed by two sets of lotus petals, three circles and four gateways. It is revered as the cosmic blueprint on which are mapped the structures and processes of all levels of creation and all categories of a being.
