At the outset let me wish you all a Happy New Year.

The 39th Anniversary of the *Devasthānam* was celebrated grandly with *Sarva Devata Abhishekam* and beautiful *Alankarams* for the main deities on July 4th 2016. We look forward to the 40th Anniversary (a milestone) on 4th of July 2017.

The inaugural conference for Hindu Young Professionals titled 'Anubhava' organized by the Council of Hindu Temples of North America (CHTNA) was held on July 30th 2016 which witnessed the dedicated and deeply involved activities of the youth of participating CHTNA member Temples including our own Temple, and this was a grand success. The Second Generation youth group of our Temple 'Akshayam' took a leading role right from advanced planning until the end of the conference and this deserves appreciation. Some member Temples of CHTNA participated in the conference and annual meeting of CHTNA was held at the Temple on July 31st 2016.

Several cultural and outreach events were conducted throughout the year. *Deepãvali* celebrations were grand. The cultural program along with lighting of 3000 candles with the participation of elected officials at the Queens Museum was the highlight. International Yoga day was celebrated on a large scale on June 19th at the Temple. This was a very successful day-long event.

The 13th anniversary of the Senior Center was celebrated on October 15th with cultural programs and a hilarious skit. *Ganeša Pātašāla* continues to grow and we encourage the readers to bring their children to join the *Pātašāla* which provides a variety of classes - details of which are on page 7. Temple is very cognizant of the needs of the youth and young professional groups. Several *seva* activities including volunteering at the soup kitchen, public garden etc. are constantly encouraged. Temple participated in the annual Breast Cancer walk on October 16th 2016.

The annual Health Fair conducted on June 12th was a success and many devotees benefited from free health services. Following this, a mini Health Fair also was organized on October 9th, providing free blood tests and eye examinations. We sincerely thank the physicians and health-care workers who helped in these events.

The monthly *Ekādaša Rudra Pārāyanam* (started in January 2015) and *Šri Suktam Pārāyanam* (started in January 2016) both done on a Saturday are well attended and more and more devotees are attracted towards chanting in the *parayanams* in large numbers. For the 14th time in succession our Temple participated in the annual "OpenHouse NY (OHNY) weekend - a statewide event on October 16th & 17th which attracted a large number of visitors to the Temple on both the days.

We take this opportunity to thank all the dedicated groups of volunteers for their sterling services. We also wish to thank our excellent staff for their devoted services. We appeal to all the devotees to volunteer their time and talents and serve \check{S} in Mahã Vallabha Ganapati.

ANUBHAVA - 2016

On Saturday, July 30th The Hindu Temple Society of North America (HTSNA) hosted *Anubhava*, an inaugural conference for Hindu young professionals at *Šri Mahã Vallabha Ganapati Devasthãnam*. Organized by the Council of Hindu Temples in North America (CHTNA) and spearheaded by *Akshayam*, the HTSNA young professional group, the conference brought together over 100 Hindu young professionals ages 20-45 from throughout the tri-state area to discuss the evolution and relevance of Hinduism in today's modern world.

Anubhava was a free all-day conference intended to promote the engagement of Hindu young professionals within the temple community as volunteers, advocates, and future leaders. Anubhava featured key-note speakers, peer-led panels, and workshops. This is the first time a conference of this scale covering this age group was hosted by HTSNA and organized by CHTNA.

The conference was split into three parts: *Bhakti Yoga, Karma Yoga*, and *Gnana Yoga*. The *Bhakti Yoga* segment focused on temple management, exploring topics such as daily ritual and temple finances. The *Karma Yoga* segment focused on seva, or volunteerism, and community relations. The third and final segment, *Gnana Yoga*, explored modern Hinduism, as it pertains to women, interfaith relations, and young people. Each section featured 3-5 panelists followed by a 45 minute discussion/workshop led by representatives of Bridgewater Temple. The conference also featured a special talk by guest speaker, Dr. M.G. Prasad, member of the Advisory Council of The Hindu Temple Society of North America and a notable academician.

Anubhava was successful in bringing together Hindu young professionals of diverse backgrounds, and pioneering a forum for them to actively engage in discussions about Hinduism and Temple Management. CHTNA and HTSNA are exploring ways in which to continue the momentum built during this conference, and make the event an annual occurrence. Akshayam meanwhile continues to plan events and volunteer opportunities for young professionals at The Hindu Temple Society of North America, and is actively seeking to expand its membership base. On Saturday, January 7th, 2017 Akshayam is hosting an arts showcase for local young professional artists, modeled after Chennai's annual December Music Festival. The event, titled "Maha Ganapati Natya Gana Sabha" will feature both musical and dance performances, and will take place at Šri Mahā Vallabha Ganapati Devasthānam. Akshayam is also actively planning for Anubhava 2017, which will likely take place in May/June of next year.

DARBHA GRASS

The holy *Darbha* grass is commonly known as *Kuša* grass in Sanskrit or *Desmostachya bipinnata* in folk medicine or *Halfa* grass / big cord grass / salt reed-grass in English. The botanical name is *Eragrostis cynosuroides*. Some scholars call it as *Višwāmitra*, meaning universal friend.

Darbha grass is considered sacred by various traditions. Rig Veda mentions about the usage of Darbha grass in religious ceremonies apart from being used as an ãsana or seat. In Bhagavad Gita, Lord Krishna specifically recommends the usage of Darbha grass as an ideal seat for meditation. Vishnu purãna and Mahãbhārata also mention about the significance and usage of Darbha grass. Hindu sages and saints like Mãrkandeya, Athri, Kaušika, Vyãsa, Kãtyãyana, Bharadwãj, yagnavalkya, ãšwalãyana, ãpasthamba have revealed about the greatness of Darbha grass. It is used as a meditation seat by Buddhists too.

In the Hindu tradition, while performing religious rituals, one need to wear a ring (pavitram) made of this Darbha grass. The count of the leaves depends upon the ritual that is held. The edges are so sharp like that of a blade and might even cut or hurt if handled carelessly. Before usage it is first washed with water and when it is in wet condition it is twisted to make a ring (pavitram) or kurcham.

It is said that during an experiment, a medical practitioner took out a bunch of *Darbha* grass in his hand and took an x-ray of his palm. To his utter surprise it was found that the grass absorbed more than 60% of the x-ray radiation! Since this holy grass can absorb X-ray radiation one can logically present that it can absorb any other harmful radiation in our atmosphere as well. Several Universities have invested in research on this *Darbha* grass.

During Solar or Lunar Eclipse, *Darbha* grass is used to cover most of the food items and ingredients to protect from the harmful ultra violet radiation.

It is found that the *Darbha* grass has the highest value in conducting the phonetic vibrations through its tip. The grass without a tip is of no value, as the conduction value in it is lost. We might have seen that priests, at the end of a ritual, reciting Vedic hymns, would sprinkle the holy water using the *Darbha* grass. The recited sound vibrations are absorbed by the holy water which is thus spread through the tip of this grass.

It is a marvel, that in those days of Vedic Era, the Hindu Sages and Saints used to control the magnetic path disturbances, just by simply using *Darbha* grass. As it is found to be a good conductor of acoustic vibration, it is widely used in various temple rituals.

Traditionally *Darbha* grass is cut and collected on *Srãvana Amãvãsya* day (between August 15th and September 15th) or *Mãsi / Mãgha Amãvãsya* day (between February 13th and March 14th) and could be retained for usage for one full year.

It is in practice that the same *Darbha* grass can be used again and again for seven times, provided, it is washed with pure water, dried properly before re-use. This is permitted only when/where no fresh grass is available for regular usage. However, once used for any inauspicious ceremonies, should never be used again.

It is believed that preserving *Darbha* grass at home would fetch us *aišwaryam* (prosperity) as it is very divine in nature and powerful. Some even spread it around their home to ward off evil.

TRAVEL DIRECTIONS TO THE TEMPLE

By Automobile: (A) If you are driving from Manhattan or points West, take I-495 East (Long Island Expressway) to Exit 24 (Kissena Blvd) and turn LEFT at Kissena Blvd.

(B) If you are driving from Long Island or points East, take I-495 West (Long Island Expressway) to Exit 24 (Kissena Blvd) and turn RIGHT at Kissena Blvd.

Drive about a mile on Kissena Blvd and turn RIGHT into Holly Avenue. Drive 3 blocks on Holly Avenue to Bowne Street. The Temple is on the LEFT side.

(C) If you are driving from Connecticut or points North, take I-95 South to I-678 South (Van Wyck Expressway). After crossing Whitestone Bridge, stay on I-678 South (RIGHT lane) and take Exit 15 to 20th Ave. At the traffic light, turn LEFT into Parsons Blvd and drive about 2.5 miles. At Flushing Hospital Medical Center (on RIGHT), turn RIGHT into 45th Ave and drive to next block. At Smart Street, turn LEFT and drive to the end of the street to Temple Parking Lot behind the temple.

(D) If you are driving from Princeton, Philadelphia or points South, take I-278 via Staten Island and take Exit 35 to I-495 East (Long Island Expressway) and follow directions as above (A).

By Public Transportation: Take Subway Train No. 7 from Times Square to Flushing Main Street (the last stop on 7 train). Then take MTA Bus Q27 from Main Street to Bowne Street on Holly Avenue. The bus runs on Kissena Blvd and turns left into Holly Ave Bus Stop. The next stop is Bowne Street near the temple. The bus ride is about 5 to 10 minutes. You may also take MTA Buses Q17, Q25 and Q34 to Kissena Blvd and Holly Avenue and walk two short blocks to the temple.

Long Island Rail Road (LIRR) Trains from Penn Station / Woodside to Port Washington also stop in Flushing Main Street, adjacent to 7 train.
