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

Dear Fellow Devotees,

Wish you all Happy Holidays and Happy New Year. The year 2017 marked a significant milestone for our Temple as we celebrated the 40th Anniversary on a grand scale, with Sarva Devata Abhishekam and a beautifully decorated Mantapa in the back of the Temple where we all witnessed special Pancha Moorthy Utsavam. A dance ballet, 'Ashta Nayika' was specially presented at the Auditorium for the Anniversary by Mukthambar Fine Arts.

Ganesh Chaturthi Celebrations were once again grand with thousands of people participating in all the functions and especially the Ratha Yãtra on the last day. Devi Navaratri and Deepãvali Celebrations were just as grand.

The Conference for Hindu Young Professionals 'Anubhava 2017' was organized on June 10th and was very successful. This included opening remarks by Swami Sarvapriyananda, Vedanta Society of New York and panel discussions on topics of interest to young professionals. The Young Professional Group - 'Akshayam' is planning a similar conference in 2018. Several other cultural and outreach programs were conducted throughout the year.

Annual Health Fair on June 11th was successful and our thanks to New York Presbyterian Hospital for their help & support. Mini Health Fair was also organized on October 8th, providing free blood tests. The response was excellent. We sincerely thank the physicians and health care workers who helped in these events. International Yoga Day on June 25th was successful. Temple played a leading role in the celebrations of IYD at the Indian Consulate on June 19th and also in the UN (as part of Permanent Mission of India to UN) on June 21st.

Patašãla continues to grow with increasing registrations. It is heartening to see dedicated teachers and volunteers conducting these classes on a regular basis. A robotics workshop was introduced for the first time in July for a week and was proven to be very successful. Sanskrit classes are continuing to be popular and it is hoped that more and more young people will join the classes.

Summer Camp on Hindu Heritage was conducted from July 31st - August 4th and was very successful. Total of 40 children participated. Dr. MG Prasad's involvement and guidance was excellent and the children really enjoyed their interactions with him. Plan is to conduct similar workshops in the coming years as well. For the 15th time in succession our Temple participated in the annual OpenHouse NY (OHNY) weekend - statewide on October 14-15, which attracted a record number of visitors to the Temple on both the days. Anniversary of the Senior Program was celebrated on November 4th with a variety program and was well participated.

We take this opportunity to thank all the groups of volunteers for their dedicated & sterling services. We also wish to thank our excellent staff for their devoted services. We appeal to all the devotees to volunteer their time and talents and serve *Šri Mahã Vallabha Ganapati*.

I wish to express my thanks to all of you for your support and friendship and appeal to you for your continued help and support for this noble cause. ANUBHAVA - 2017

A Look-back at the Anubhava 2017 Conference by: Abiramy Logeswaran

"You are a billionaire but you don't know which bank has your money. You do not have access to it so you are living on welfare. Where are the keys to unlocking this wealth? The most ancient civilization and the youngest civilization meet in you. This combination of the ancient and modern, you do not know how good you have it. The fundamental questions of life, the best answers that humanity has ever come across are found in your Hindu heritage".

These were the opening words delivered by His Holiness Swami Sarvapriyananda, Resident Swami at the Vedanta Society of New York, to inaugurate the second annual Anubhava Conference. Held back in June and organized by Akshayam (The Young Professionals Group, The Hindu Temple Society of North America), this conference has become an annual tradition for Hindu young professionals to come together and be offered a grand platform to voice and discuss their opinions and share their beliefs and questions with like-minded peers. The next generation is given this unique opportunity to lead efforts and be led by the Sanathana Dharma that each one upholds individually. They then come together to discuss their future contribution to upholding Hindu values and carrying forward the traditions that have survived the test of time.

Anubhava 2017 explored the complex identity that young Hindus in America share and offered guidance in finding common ground that unites us amidst all of the diverse values, practices and traditions that fall under the large Hindu umbrella. There was a specific focus on how this Hindu identity manifested in guiding people's personal and professional lives and helping shape their respective careers.

Swami Sarvapriyananda, a business graduate, was able to relate to the challenges that Hindu young professionals face in America. He conveyed to the audience how proud they should be to be carrying forward the treasures of the Indian heritage. This was followed by an address by the keynote speaker Reshma Saujani, CEO & Co-Founder of Girls Who Code, who shared some of the challenges that she faced growing up as a girl pursing a career in a field that was heavily male-dominated and how she used those obstacles to step to success. This was followed by panel discussions featuring Sriram Emani (CEO, Indian Raga), Bharathi Sethumadhavan (Program Officer, Clark Foundation), Nishant Ceyyur (CEO, Excelsior Consulting Group), Aditi Banerjee (Corporate Counsel, Prudential), Seema Aggarwal M.D. (Pulmonologist) and Rome Chopra (CEO, CXC Productions). Panelists addressed topics including how to maintain a Hindu identity at corporate events where cocktails and non-vegetarian options are served, how to combat cultural misappropriation in social media and how to tackle issues that face young Hindus. The conference closed with a meet & greet session with all of the guest speakers.

Akshayam invites all young Hindus to join its efforts in whatever capacity to engage in seva, question and discuss topics of interest and unite with the Blessings of Šri Mahã Vallabha Ganapati to continue the ongoing legacy of this Temple.



<u>PRADAKSHINAM</u>

Circumambulation of self, a sacred object or a place is referred as *Pradakshinam*. It is an integral part of sign of prayer & worship. In Sanskrit, *Pradakshinam* means, circumambulation "to the right" in a clock-wise direction. The meaning is derived from the root words *Prãch / Prãchi* for "East", *Prãk* for "in front" *dakshina* for "South", *Prãtichi* for "West". The root word dakshina also refers to one's right side. Hence circumambulation or moving/walking or go-around in a clockwise path either

East-South-West directions or from one's front side and turning towards his/her right side and move around.

It is a religious custom to circumambulate self or a sacred object or a place making it as a generic form of prayer. *Parikrama* is another word used to refer "traverse around" by walking to various pilgrimage sites.

There are different types of *Pradakshinam*: *Ãtma Pradakshinam* (go-around oneself), *Agni Pradakshinam* (go-around the sacred fire - *Homa* or *Havan Kund*, *Yãga* or *Yagnašãlã*), *Vruksha Pradakshinam* (go-around sacred plants and trees viz. *Tulsi* plant, *Peepal* tree), *Giri Pradakshinam* (go-around sacred mountain viz. *Govardhana giri* or *Thiruvannamalai* mountain), *Ãlaya Pradakshinam* (go-around temple and various shrines in it), *Adi Pradakshinam* (step-by-step walking), *Sayana Pradakshinam* or *Anga Pradakshinam* (go-around by rolling down the entire body in lying posture), *Namaskãra Pradakshinam* (go-around step-by-step in prostration posture by bowing down hands, knees, shoulders, chest and forehead). *Grãma Pradakshinam* (go-around the village, religious leaders or king go-around the city). In *Šiva* Temple there is a special *Pradakshinam* done, known as *Soma-sutra Pradakshinam* during *Pradosham* time.

Pradakshinam should be done in a meditative mood. In a Temple, the inner most shrine is referred as *Sukshma Sareera* (subtle or astral body) and rest of the place till the outer most *prãkãram* is referred as *Sthula Sareera* (gross body). The spiritual energy (cosmic energy) radiated from the inner most deity, is said to traverse around the space, in a similar form as that of the magnetic field force, which cannot be prevented by any insulative material including a brick or a stone wall and the field energy lines never cross each other. The cosmic energy does not stop or start anywhere, they always make a closed loop and will continue. While the priest performs the rituals including invoking the divinity in the shrine, more energy emits, increasing the strength of the cosmic energy field and hence devotees get benefitted in receiving the cosmic energy while circumambulating the shrine.

There are different opinions regarding the guidelines in terms of number of *Pradakshinam* / circumambulations viz 1,3,5,7,9,11,21,54,108,1008 etc. First, it depends on the perimeter of one *Pradakshinam* and the *sãnnidhyam* / quantum of energy level being radiated from the deity. Secondly, it depends on the level of satisfaction of the indivdual devotee. Thirdly, the devotee, with gratitude for their prayer being answered, makes a promise to carry out a specific number of *Pradakshinam*. It is advisable that one should circumambulate, moving every step slowly, with great care, with folded hands and in a meditative mood, chanting a *mantra* or *šloka* with deep devotion.

TRAVEL DIRECTIONS TO THE TEMPLE

By Automobile: (A) If you are driving **from Manhattan or points West**, take I-495 East (Long Island Expressway) to Exit 24 (Kissena Blvd) and turn LEFT at Kissena Blvd.

(B) If you are driving **from Long Island or points East**, take I-495 West (Long Island Expressway) to Exit 24 (Kissena Blvd) and turn RIGHT at Kissena Blvd.

Drive about a mile on Kissena Blvd and turn RIGHT into Holly Avenue. Drive 3 blocks on Holly Avenue to Bowne Street. The Temple is on the LEFT side.

(C) If you are driving **from Connecticut or points North**, take I-95 South to I-678 South (Van Wyck Expressway). After crossing Whitestone Bridge, stay on I-678 South (RIGHT lane) and take Exit 15 to 20th Ave. At the traffic light, turn LEFT into Parsons Blvd and drive about 2.5 miles. At Flushing Hospital Medical Center (on RIGHT), turn RIGHT into 45th Ave and drive to next block. At Smart Street, turn LEFT and drive to the end of the street to Temple Parking Lot behind the temple.

(D) If you are driving **from Princeton, Philadelphia or points South**, take I-278 via Staten Island and take Exit 35 to I-495 East (Long Island Expressway) and follow directions as above (A).

By Public Transportation: Take Subway **Train No. 7** from Times Square to Flushing Main Street (the last stop on 7 train). Then take MTA **Bus Q27** from Main Street to Bowne Street on Holly Avenue. The bus runs on Kissena Blvd and turns left into Holly Ave Bus Stop. The next stop is Bowne Street near the temple. The bus ride is about 5 to 10 minutes. You may also take MTA **Buses Q17, Q25** and **Q34** to Kissena Blvd and Holly Avenue and walk two short blocks to the temple.

Long Island Rail Road **(LIRR)** Trains from Penn Station / Woodside to Port Washington also stop in Flushing Main Street, adjacent to 7 train.
